Words For the 2023-2024 Bridge Year -

As the 2023-2024 bridge year begins, it is time for every member in District 16 to take a deep breath, push up your sleeves, and get to work. All squadrons/clubs have an opportunity this year to stabilize and grow. I believe that reaching out to our communities by teaching our classes and seminars is critical to bringing in new members. It is also critical to develop and nurture our existing members. If we focus on both, we will stabilize and grow.

How do we do this? Each squadron/club can begin the process by establishing some measurable goals that can focus on immediate needs as well as goals that after two to three years will help establish continuity between bridge years. The goals can and should have member input regarding the classes, seminars and other educational offerings they would like to have. Additionally, member input as to boating and on-land activities can increase participation.

Engage your members by asking for help with short-term projects or committees. Engaged members typically stay engaged ... which means member retention. For example, members can call other members, set up the room for a meeting, make reservations for a dinner outing, bake a pie, etc. You get the picture.

Use the resources on the National and District websites. Do you use the Info Center on the National website? Have you checked the Resources tab on the District website? There is a "boat load" of information on these sites.

Call a District officer if you have a question. The district bridge is committed to helping wherever and whenever they can. If the officer doesn't know the answer, that officer will go to National to get the answer.

Come to the conferences and district sponsored rendezvous'. The Poulsbo rendezvous has been given a boost this year by changing some things and adding back some previous activities. The raffle is back with a twist. This year any squadron/club that donates an item valued at \$50 or more, will go home with some money. All raffle proceeds will be equally divided between the participating squadron and district.

Cooperative Charting will be added with a Geodetic Marker and an on-the-water activity. If you are unsure how the Cooperative Charting Program works, join the group. Try it out and add it as a squadron/club event, i.e. Scavenger Hunt.

Boat Operator Certification (BOC) returns to our Poulsbo rendezvous. Ted Shanks from North Olympic Sail and Power Squadron will be leading the group of our own mariners through the paces to become an IN (Inland Navigator). The BOC program recently received a \$1500 donation of funds designated for the program. P/D/C L.D. Brown, SN-CN managed the account and transitioned the money to our District 16 budget. This money will provide the district the ability to support the expenses of the BOC program.

These items are just a beginning of ideas to consider. Put on your "thinking cap", take a deep breath, push up your sleeves and get to work.

First, an excellent education program to get new members, and second, fun, interesting meetings and cruises to keep all members. This is not a new idea. Its been around for many years, never better said than "Come for the education, stay for the friends". Our District is doing a good job communicating with squadrons, thanks to our DEO Jim West, webmaster Jim Haglund, and our amazing secretary Barbara Erickson. But we need squadrons to re-focus on better education and more fun. That's my plan. Please help me make those happen with your ideas and energy..

The sun came out yesterday bright and clear and nicely warm. I hope you are all looking forward to a new summer season of boating or RVing, or whatever your choice of recreation is.

Looking back over the last three months, a lot more than the weather has changed. With the easing of COVID issues, and the expiration of in person meeting restrictions, we are now starting to see Squadrons hold their regular monthly meeting in person, which is a relief. I was honored to represent the District Commander at two squadrons Changes of Watch: Bellingham and North Olympic. In both cases I was welcomed with accustomed USPS hospitality. Let people know that we are out there, and can assist with basic Boater Education, Navigation Instruction, and associated information like our Elective Classes. If you know someone who needs an updated Vessel Safety Check, put them in touch with your local VSE contact, or let P/D/C Craig Brown know and he will be happy to find one of our district Examiners to assist.

As I said above, a lot of us will be out boating this summer or otherwise enjoying the Pacific Northwest recreational opportunities, so there won't be many classes until fall. However, it is not too early to begin thinking about the upcoming months, if not actually planning for classes. Reach out to marinas and yacht clubs, find out what gaps exist in their boating knowledge, and see what we can do to help fill those gaps. Fine weather such as is predicted for this coming week will mean that there will be more boaters out on the waters of Puget Sound and our lakes and rivers. I got an updated report from our government contacts that more than 700 people died in various water related tragedies, most of which could have been avoided with more education and training. Our mission in the United States Power Squadrons is to provide that training, so let's all see if we can't get our name and brand out there.

In closing, let me wish each and every one of you the very best wishes for a fun and above all safe summer of recreation. I hope to see you out on the water.

This is the site where you can create Squadron Reports. Reports that can provide you with the status of each member of your squadron. Most common Status Terms are:

- Dues Status: one month before dues are due.
- Past Due: Past Payment due date
- NON-Renewal: member is no longer a member of USPS|ABC
- Past Member: Non-renewal previous year

You will need your Squadron Account Code as well as the Squadron Password. That would be the "user, updater or master" password. If you need help, please don't hesitate to reach out to me.

What does one do with this report? Use the [Due] list to thank them for being members, remind them of the upcoming events and a subtle hint that their membership renewal is coming up soon. Use the [Past Due] list to reach out to check to see if they forgot to pay their membership renewal. Use the [Non-Renewal] list to conduct an "exit interview." It all takes time. But it is worth it to retain a member. Let me know how you use the Reports feature or if you have tips, share them **Please**.

Subj: BOATING SAFETY APPLICATION FOR SMART PHONES

- 1. The Coast Guard Boating Safety application has allowed smart phone users on the Apple and Android mobile operating system platforms to input a profile, email a float plan, review safety equipment requirements, and obtain emergency assistance, as well as other features. Unfortunately, the application is no longer available in the application stores since updates have not been possible.
- 2. The Coast Guard is exploring the future of the application and hopes to put out additional information in the next 90 days. In the meantime, Auxiliarists should advise anyone who is interested in the application that it is not available, and users who have the application on their smart phones should be advised to delete it until further notice.
- 3. Questions should be directed to the Boating Safety Division (CG-BSX-2) at (202) 372-1062 or at rbsinfo@uscg.mil.
- 4. Internet release is authorized.

For many reasons including the value of keeping communication lines clear and open as well as facilitating access to training and educational tools, all Auxiliarists are urged to have their own email address and to keep it updated in AUXDATA II.
